Thursday Night's meeting

Kairen Patterson outlined the reasons why the group (now only 5 down from 10) is going to Cambodia instead of Schoolies Week. They are going to Siem Reap to build a house with Life and Hope Assoc. for a family (similar to our house building) and then the 3 students Jade, Jordan and Georgia, gave an outline of their itinerary, what they were going to do (plant trees at schools, assess family needs,

assess Rice Scholarships) and places to visit including Ankor Wat, Phare Circus, Ton le Sap, 'Blossom' a hospitality training school, PAGE hostel for girls, markets and a visit to a hospital with Trauma Teddies.

Kairen hoped the students would see first-hand what the problems were in Cambodia, especially the poverty, then finished the presentation with details of costs \$3,000/student (who has to pay half), how the fundraising has gone, and sought support from Rotary to make up the short-fall.

Michael thanked the group and wished them well, with a few questions from members.

Kim Saxon also spoke during the meal to table a submission to the board, outlining additional bikes and training for Bike Education for Euroa Secondary College. The submission will be considered soon by the board.
