## Thursday Night's Meeting



A simple request from the Editor for a photograph of the two Rotarians speaking at Thursday's meeting resulted in this caper! Brian Bamford spoke on the club's application to the State Government for the Pick my Project Grant and Denis Nolan, Membership Chair spoke on the direction of the membership committee for this year.

A change of speaker was needed for Thursday night's meeting and members Brian Bamford and Denis Nolan stepped up to help out. Denis told the meeting that the job of maintaining a healthy membership of the club is the job of all members. "Our Club is dependent on new members coming on board." "If we take care of our members they will take care of the club and our town". He reminded us that membership of Rotary is by invitation. "it is vital that all members keep of sharp focus on the membership of the club."

Brian outlined the Pick my Project grants now made available by the Victorian Government. \$30 million has been set aside and he, in consultation with others in the club, quickly put in for \$170,000 to install tiered, movable seating for the Cinema/Town Hall facility so the space can be used for other activities. At the moment, all cinema seats are bolted to the floor, limiting the use of the hall. A list of potentially successful applications will be posted for residents of the shire to vote on.
