VP Brian was standing in for Bernie and praised the Long Lunch for delivering such a great time for all and the possible \$12,000 profit, more details from Helen next meeting.

Don Board reported on the best FM ever, \$2,600 banked. Fantastic weather and many, many people.

Jay explained the walk as raising money for the Melanoma Institute Australian. This is his third walk, which started on the 31st March in Adelaide and Wednesday was day 25. He has a support team of 6 and he went through their roles. The MIA is in Nth Sydney, it has been around since 1958, and for more information check out its website by googling Melanoma Institute Aust.

Jay devotes his energy to the MIA after surviving a Melanoma and most of the team have some association with someone with Melanoma and understand that research is necessary to find a cure as 5 people a day die from Melanoma related illness in Australia.

A team member Lisa explained that her sister was diagnosed with a fungal disease under a toe nail which eventually was diagnosed as a melanoma. Her advice was get checked out and go with your gut feeling if you are not happy with the treatment. The research done at the Institute helps.

The night was most informative and we hope that their Gala Dinner in May will be a successful money-raiser.

Rob thanked the team for their presentation on the night and VP Brian handed them the proceeds of the raffle.

Rob asked if anyone knew the whereabouts of the new microphone???
